A Week of Guided Prayer

A week of Guided Prayer is available again this year in preparation for Christmas. The week will begin on **Sunday 22nd November** and end on **Saturday 28th November.** Participants from last year's group will speak at all Masses on the week-end 31st October/1st November.

The commitment required is one hour of prayer per day. That consists of half an hour of private prayer at a time and place of one's own choosing. The second half hour is spent meeting with your personal prayer guide at an allocated agreed time during the day. Prayer space will be facilitated in the Church during morning sessions and in the Parish Centre during afternoon and evening sessions.
