Ash Wednesday

Next Wednesday is Ash Wednesday. Sachets of Blessed Ashes will be available, for collection, in the Church from 9.00 a.m. until dusk, with the exception of Mass times which is in private from 12.-50 to 1.30 p.m. The ashes may be administered privately in your home or in the workplace.

Shrove Tuesday,

Shrove Tuesday also commonly referred to as Pancake Day, is a celebration that's observed the day before Ash Wednesday. With Lent on the way it provides one last opportunity to splurge a little and eat whatever you want! Fr. Peter loves a good pancake!

- At the front of the altar a <u>small shrine</u> will be placed, with images reminding us that LENT is a time to pray, to fast, to think of others, and a time for penance and hope.
- Trocaire Boxes are available to take home.
- <u>Stations of the Cross</u>. At the back of the Church, you will find Stations of the Cross for children and adults to take home.
- <u>Spiritual Posters and Banners</u> are placed at the entrances to remind us of the season of lent.
