We have had a busy and eventful Autumn in our Parish. Starting off in September with the Blessing of School Bags, which in turn began the preparation of the Parish **Registration Programme for Sacramental Preparation in 2024.**

One again a sincere thanks to all who helped with the wonderful **Harvest Thanksgiving** display followed by the Annual Blessing of the Pets.

The Home and Away Prayer Week has been deeply appreciated by so many visitors to the Church as we remember family, friends, and acquaintances who are living abroad. During the last few weeks, the subsidence outside the main door of the Church has been rectified. So many people have passed favourable comments on the small construction job that improved the front aspect of the Church.

During the month of October, we met in discussion with the Dublin Diocese Building on Hope Programme, with the parishes of Monkstown/Kill of the Grange/Foxrock/and Guardian Angels. We continue to extend a warm welcome to all in our parish family and our Blackrock community.
