Our beautiful Evie Hone window in St Anne's Aisle in our parish Church here in Blackrock was commissioned to commemorate Brigid McGuire who died in 1953. It is probably the last stained-glass window completed by Evie Hone, as she died in 1955. It stands in contrast to the other windows in the church, both in style and colouring.

Our Lady, The Blessed Mother and Child, is flanked by St. Brigid and St. Patrick. The figures are effected in great power and strength. The colours to match are bold and strong. These are real people and not representations of simplistic piety. St Brigid holds her cross, and at her feet is a lamb recalling her early life as shepherdess and overhead, her first church, Cill Dara, the Church of the Oak.
