Easter Dues



There are two Tap Machines at the back of the Church.


•In the 'Donate to Parish' Tap machine your contributions go towards candles, booklets, Church maintenance and repairs.

A Message from Fr. Peter

When visitors enter our Church, we receive many positive comments which include 'The Church is beautiful and look at the shine on the floor'!

That shine is made possible by our two groups of voluntary cleaners, who so diligently look after our Church with pride.

This Easter I wish to say thank you to all our volunteers and staff, the Choir and Choir-director and organist who play such an important role in keeping St. John the Baptist a welcoming and functioning parish.

The Parish Pastoral Council have met and were responsible for the successful Lent at Night prayer and song evening, which took place two weeks ago in association with our Building Hope grouping of parishes. They are also continuing to contact new volunteers who have responded to our volunteer appeal. In April they, with Fr. Peter will meet the Eucharistic ministers and readers on separate evenings.

The Finance Committee wish to thank parishioners for their contributions to the various parish maintenance initiatives – The Parish Christmas and Easter Offerings – the quarterly Parish Maintenance Fund collection - and the tap/card machine that is now beside the tap machine for Mass collections. During the next few months, we will be looking at the Church roof which has lost some slates in the winter storms, the fire alarm system, and the Church lighting.

In the coming weeks we will celebrate First Holy Communions and Confirmations for Carysfort National School, Willow Park School, and St. Augustine's School. Thank you to the parents of Carysfort, our parish school, for their great support at our preparation Masses.

Our Sacred Space included prayer displays for St. Brigid, St. Patrick, and for the season of Lent. This weekend the Easter Garden will be there. We have received such positive reactions from all who visit it. The Lent Prayer Box, which contained wishes and petitions to be prayed for at Masses during the season of Lent, has received over 300 requests.

Our weekday and Sunday Mass numbers are steadily increasing. The 1.05 p.m. Mass fluctuates between 40 and 90 people each day and our Sunday Mass count has increased to over 420 people most weekends and over 550 people when the Sacramental preparation Masses are celebrated.

All the above and more go to making our parish an open, welcoming environment that celebrates our place in the mutli cultural community of Blackrock where we welcome people from every culture, nationality, gender, and creed.

Thank you for your support and in the words of Jesus in the Easter gospel 'Go Forth and spread the good news'.
