This weekend in our Mass we celebrate the Ascension of our Lord into heaven and the beginning of the period of prayer awaiting the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. Pentecost, which we will celebrate next Sunday, marks the beginning of the Church and the start of its mission.
