Regrettably, the demand for these vital services continues to increase, and Crosscare relies on your generosity to reach as many people as possible who need help. As a brief example of our work with those most in need-last year, we at Crosscare

- Provided accommodation for 800 individuals and families who have no home.
- Supported 12,000 people, including those facing homelessness, those on low incomes, and those marginalised.
- Helped 180 young people who left care when they turned 18 and faced life on their own.
- Helped 750 families, including 1500 children who experienced food poverty.
- Expanded our youth services-street work, detached work, and outreach to over 4,500 marginalised children, young people, and their families.
