November Altar List of the Dead





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The month of November gives us the opportunity to remember our dear departed when we enter their names on the Altar List of the Dead, so that they may be prayed for at all Masses during November and on the first Friday of each month for the coming year. If you wish to have the names of your loved ones inscribed on the list, there are envelopes at the back of the Church.

These can be returned in the collection baskets at Mass, or placed in the safe, or to the Parish Office. Contributions and donations for the November List of the Dead go directly to support your local parish clergy when they offer prayers and Masses.

St. John Henry Cardinal Newman will be declared the 38th doctor of the Church by Pope Leo at the Jubilee Year Mass this Saturday 1st November the Solemnity of All Saints.

Cardinal Newman is viewed as one of the great modern thinkers of Christianity. He is perhaps best known for his lectures on university education, later published as the Idea of a University. As the 38th person in the 2,000-year-old history of the Church to receive the title doctor, he will join other influential philosophers and theologians such as St. Augustine of Hippo, St. Thomas Aguinas, St. Catherine of Siena, and St. Thérése of Lisieux. Cardinal Newman founded the Catholic University in 1854. It became secular in 1908 and was renamed University College Dublin.

The following is based on his wonderful reflection:

The Mission of My Life God has created me to do Him some definite service. He has committed to me a work He has given to no other. I may not know it now, but I shall know it hereafter. I am a link in His chain, a bond of His love. Whatever I am, I cannot be lost, for He knows what He is about. In sorrow or in peace, in doubt or in joy, my life shall serve Him. I will trust Him.
